What is a proper safe job procedure to follow?

- Inspect work area for sufficient swing room and any hazards that may be present (overhead wires, etc.)
- Do a pre-trip inspection on machine using Cold Start Procedure
- Ensure bucket and boom are working properly
- Follow through with task carefully. Always be aware of your surroundings
- Park on level ground with bucket to the ground
- Allow for enough cool down time before shutting off machine
- Close and lock doors plus install window guards
- Dismount machine using 3 point contact method.
