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What are some good general safe work practices?

- **DO** ensure that prior to commencement of any excavation that all underground and/or overhead lines have been identified, exposed and well marked/flagged.
- **DO** ensure that traffic near roads or busy access ways is under control.
- DO use traffic controllers/flaggers.
- DO set up barricades.
- DO provide ladders in immediate area for access/egress of trenches, excavations.
- **DO** ensure that here the cut back method is not possible, provide timber shoring, trench jacks, sheet piling, cage or other approved method.
