What are some general safe work practices?

- **DO** Ensure you are fully trained.
- **DO** Follow manufacturer's recommendations on safe use and recommended personal protective equipment (PPE)
- **DO** ensure all sources of ignition are eliminated or controlled.
- **DO** ensure equipment is grounded.
- **DO** ensure area is well ventilated.
- **DO NOT** smoke around spray painting operations.
- **DO** ensure warning signs are in place.
- **DO** Use proper PPE when spray painting such as self contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) or respirator depending on the task and process
- **DO** Always wash hands prior to smoking or eating
