## What are some good general safe work practices?

- DO ensure all rocks and sharp objects are removed.
- DO ensure blades are on correctly.
- DO ensure hands, feet and hearing is protected.
- DO NOT service or fuel the equipment while it is running.
- **DO** follow safe job procedure for refueling as set out by the manufacture
- DO ensure the right mix of oil and gas is used.
- DO ensure head is greased.
- DO ensure guards are in place at all times.
- **DO** follow Roto Tiller and Edger manufacturer instructions for safe operation.
