What are some good general safe work practices?

- **DO** isolate system according to safe job procedure.
- **DO** Depressurize and drain system.
- **DO** purge the system if combustible materials or hazardous gas, vapor, dust or fumes exist.
- **DO** isolate all lines tying into the system.
- **DO** install locking devices and tags on all valves that would affect the system if operated.
- **DO** continually monitor the area for combustible material and hazardous gases.
- **DO** Remove Lock Out Devices.

- **Note:** Lock out devices can only be removed by the persons that installed them.
