- **DO** follow lock-out / tag-out procedures
- DO Know how to work safely with <u>flammable and combustible liquids</u>
- DO know how to work safety with compressed gases
- DO know how to work safely with power tools, and
- DO follow safe work procedures on ladders, and platforms / scaffolds
- DO follow manual material handling (lifting) techniques
