## What is a proper safe job procedure to follow?

- Use Cold Start Procedure and do pre-trip inspection while machine is warming up
  - Check for:
    - Hydraulic or fuel leaks or loose bolts
    - Lights and back up alarm are working
    - Hydraulics are running properly
- Mount and dismount machine using 3 point contact
- Proceed to work area checking steering and brakes as you go
- Maintain proper distance from other workers and equipment and always look directly behind before backing
- Pay constant attention to all gauges
- When stopped, check machine over and do not drag winch cable or have hook dangling loosely
- Park in safe area and drop the hydraulics
- Use Hot Shut Down Procedure
- Check over machine, clean radiator and tracks when finished.
