What is a proper safe job procedure to follow?

- Check all appropriate fluid levels and record in pre-trip book
- Visually inspect for leaks and worn belts
- Do a walk around inspection to ensure it is safe to start machine
- Proceed to start engine using the three point contact to enter machine
- Let machine idle and do another overall check for leaks
- Once machine is warm, proceed to task
