What is a proper safe job procedure to follow?

- Take out cord and ensure it is out of the way of walking path or warn workers to watch footing
- Check for damage such as frays and proper 3 prong end on cord
- When plugging cord in to outlet, do not force
- Roll cord neatly once task is complete
- Hang in proper location
- Report any damaged cords and take them out of service
